THE MINIMUM FINE IS \$500.00 WITH A \$1500.00 MAXIMUM.

A COPY OF THE FINAL ELECTRICAL CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE MUST BE SUBMITTED TO THE CITY OF BINGHAMTON.

BEFORE ANY CERTIFICATE OF OCCUPANCY OR COMPLIANCE CAN BE ISSUED, THE ELECTRICAL CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE CITY OF BINGHAMTON



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NOTICE TO HOMEOWNERS APPLYING FOR RESIDENTIAL ELECTRICAL PERMITS

1. The applicant must be the occupant of the one, two or three family residential building. No homeowner's electrical permit will be issued for buildings that exceed three residential units, mixed use, commercial or industrial. If the structure is a vacant one, two or three family building, along with the application for the electrical permit, a letter by the owner stating that he/she will be the intended occupant upon completion of the electrical work.
2. The applicant must perform all electrical work.
3. No electrical wiring is to be covered until inspected by approved inspection agency. **It is the responsibility of the applicant to arrange for all inspections.** Upon completion of the electrical work a final inspection is required.
4. **All work that was not inspected before it was covered, will be required to be exposed for inspection.**
5. All fees for inspections are made directly to the approved agency. There is no fee for the City of Binghamton Electrical Permit.
6. Any electrical work covered without an inspection constitutes a failed inspection. Per Section 225-6D of the Electrical Code, two failed inspection voids the homeowners electrical permit and a Licensed Master Electrician must file for a electrical permit and complete the necessary work.
7. All work must comply with the New York State Building Code, the National Electrical Code and the City of Binghamton's Code of Ordinances.
8. **Electrical Permit expires one year from date of issuance. If electrical work is not finalized within the one year from date of issuance, an inspection of the completed work will be required. That electrical work, if in compliance will be approved and another electrical permit and all associated fees to the New York Board of Fire Underwriters will be required to complete the electrical work.**
